
CHALLENGE, INVEST, CHANGE: Adopting a Regional Approach to System Improvement

Background

The West Moreton Care at the End of Life Committee was established in July 2018
The original committee was established and governed through West Moreton Health (WMH). In 2019, the Committee evolved into a Collaborative, with a Chairperson from an NGO member and Secretariat from WMH.

Aim

The aim of the Collaborative is to develop partnerships across government and nongovernment services in order to optimise systems and processes that will improve outcomes for people living with life limiting illness in the West Moreton community.


